- -We are in conversation with Chandler about wreaths and poinsettias for Anna Julia. Should we order fake wreaths they can use year after year? (The shedding was a bit of an issue to keep tidy) Would club members donate on preorder?
- -We want to consider working with The Light House RVA perhaps a flower workshop which would be much easier to coordinate than with Caritas, as the women meet on specific dates and the group is not as large.

Kelly, Barrie, Freddie, Christina, Betsy, Bonnie and Preston met prior to the September meeting to discuss the below opportunity from Rosemarie Bundy and the Virginia War Memorial. Our committee is excited about this opportunity as it feeds so beautifully into Kelly's vision for our centennial in 5 years- to plant 100 white oaks in and around Richmond over the next 10 years or so (all TBD). These first 5 trees for the War Memorial would be the perfect jump off point. Bonnie and Preston assured us we have the funding for the War Memorial without stressing the coffers. We presented the War Memorial opportunity at our Sept 20th meeting and needed to vote on it as a club at our October meeting. Moving forward after these initial 5 white oaks, we would plant 1.5 inch caliper trees which reduces the cost to buy and install greatly.

Pam Seay, President of the VWM Foundation, has offered us the opportunity of being the designated supporter of "The Gold Star Oak Grove". The Gold Star designation, as I am sure you know, is for members of the military who have died during their service to our Country. The Oak Grove will consist of five, 3" caliper, native White Oak (Quercus Alba) trees. The trees will initially be 14 to 16 feet in height and will reach a height of 80 to 100 feet with a wide canopy of 40 to 70 feet. Specimens have been documented to be over 450 years old. The trees will be located together in a very prominent area. The estimated cost per tree is \$1,500.00 for a total gift totaling \$9,000.00. This amount will be matched by one of the Foundations already "on board' and the additional funds will be used for other plantings.
